## St. Louis: An Historic French Town

### **DESIGN CLASSES**

Frenchman Pierre Laclede founded St. Louis on America's big river. Class 1. "Meandering Down the Mighty Mississippi"- a Creative design featuring water

Napoleon Bonaparte sold land that included St. Louis to the United States. Class 2. "The Louisiana Purchase of 1803" - a Traditional Mass design.

Powell Hall, the home of St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, was modeled after the Palace of Versailles Class 3. "Music in the Hall of Mirrors" – a Reflective design

St. Louis' exotic dancer Josephine Baker was a sensation in Paris when she performed her sensual dance routines.

Class 4. "The Black Pearl Dances" – a Multi-Rhythmic design

Bissinger's French Confections got its start in Paris where handcrafted chocolates are renowned. Class 5. "Classic Chocolate Treats" – a Creative mass design. Out of state exhibitors are encouraged to enter. Plant material provided and containers provided

Staging: All designs will be staged on a table in front of black backgrounds that measure 36" height by 30" width. Backgrounds may be draped. Table will have a black covering.

#### **DESIGN RULES AND INFORMATION**

**1.** All design classes are open to any amateur or professional designer. There will be four entries per class.

2. All entries are requested to be pre-registered by June 10, 2017. To reserve your space and for any questions, contact Kim Peterson, 1705 Carroll, St. Louis, MO 63104. 314-421-6272. kprp@swbell.net.

3. All designs must be in place by *9am*, *Friday*, *June 30*, *2017* and must be removed at *3pm*, *Sunday*, *July 2*, *2017*. Exhibitor must maintain all designs in show condition throughout the show.

4. Exhibitors may make only one (1) entry in a class.

5. A true lily or lilies must be in all exhibits. Plant material need not be grown by exhibitor. Accessories may be used in all classes. Fresh plant material may not be treated.

6. No artificial flowers or foliage may be used, or any plants on any state's Noxious Weed Conservation List.

7. Standard system of awards will be used. A panel of National Garden Club judges will judge using NGC rules.

8. Properties should be labeled. NALS, any regional society or the Sheraton are NOT responsible for loss, damage or theft.
